Dear Resident

The Penneshaw CWMS Project is now under construction and increasing levels of pre-construction activity will be seen in / around the township. We are not planning any heavy equipment work in the town and beach areas during the months of December / January so as to provide minimum disruption to the holiday season and to the inevitable increase in pedestrians and traffic.

Over the next three weeks surveying of the main collection lines will commence in the road reserves and roads in the defined collection area between Cape Willoughby Road junction (School) to the west and lower Cheopis Street to the east. In addition the proposed extension area to the east of Cheopis Street and as far west as Rapide Tce and south to Mansell / Pelican Street. This will result in pegs being placed in the road reserve that will indicate the likely position of the connection point for each property. We would appreciate these pegs not being disturbed once installed.

Late January onwards will see work in the town commence and lines etc excavated and installed. Before a line is installed there will be an opportunity for the contractor and Supervising Engineer to double-check the anticipated position of the connection and its relation to your boundary and the likely route for your property connection pipe to the connection point to the scheme. Where possible this will be situated to minimise disruption to existing infrastructure, gardens, etc although in some cases significant disruption may not be able to be avoided.

This is an essential project for the town and it will inevitably cause a degree of disturbance and inconvenience, however the resulting scheme will provide significant environmental, economic and social returns to the township so we appeal for your forbearance during construction.
