

FACT SHEET WHAT CAN GO IN THE **YELLOW** LID KERBSIDE RECYCLING BIN

Many household items are recyclable in the kerbside yellow lid bin. Some items may ONLY be recyclable via the FRWA Waste and Recycling Depots (KIRRC on Kangaroo Island) – like E-waste, mobile phones,....all of which are FREE to dispose of at these sites.

HANDY HINTS **YELLOW** LID KERBSIDE RECYCLING BIN



SOFT PLASTIC: can be recycled through the Redcycle program at participating shopping outlets (Coles & Woolworths)



DO THE SCRUNCH TEST: to make sure plastic items are **rigid** and can go into the recycle bin scrunch them in your hand. If they bounce back into their original shape they are good to go



METAL & PLASTIC LIDS: gather up in a container of the same material type - plastic lids into a plastic milk bottle, metal lids into steel can (squash the opening of the can so they don't fall out)



PAINT TINS: to remove excess paint tip onto newspaper, let dry & put into general waste, or purchase paint hardener from your local hardware store. Make sure tins that go into your recycling bin are clean and dry



WINE BOTTLE LIDS: Remove inner plastic lining & gather lids in aluminium can or scrunch with foil
