Council introduces special camping permit deal for residents

14 September 2016: Local families who like to spend time camping on the Island are being offered a special deal by Kangaroo Island Council with the introduction this week of annual camping permits for residents.

Kangaroo Island Council CEO Andrew Boardman said, "if as a family you do more than 4-5 nights camping a year at a powered site in any of our Council campgrounds, you'll be saving money".

Fees for powered sites at Council campgrounds are \$27.00 per site per night for two people plus \$6.00 per additional person. Non-powered sites cost \$17.00 per site per night for two people plus \$6.00 for per additional person.

Annual family camping permits will cost \$120.00, with single annual camping permits costing \$60.00.

Additional guests are still \$6.00 a night, but it's an honesty system.

"The great thing about the permits is that they can be used all year round, as often as you like, and permit holders can stay in the one camping site for up to seven days.

"The only reason the seven day limit was introduced was to ensure site availability for non-residents in peak season."

Council campsites are located at American River, Duck Lagoon, Middle River, Vivonne Bay, Emu Bay and Browns Beach.

Permits must be attached to the tent, not the vehicle, so they are visible to the General Inspectors regardless of whether the car is present or not.

If you want to buy an annual camping permit, they can be purchased from Customer Service at the Kangaroo Island Council in Kingscote. Applicants will need to provide proof of residency.
